FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is included in my Skyrail Experience?

- A 7.5km cableway journey through Australia's Tropical Rainforests.
- Rainforest boardwalks, with interpretive signage.
- Guided Ranger tours at Red Peak Station.
- Entry to the Rainforest Interpretation Centre at Barron Falls Station.
- Lookouts and historical displays at Barron Falls Station.
- Trip Guides: available in 11 languages.

What are Skyrail's hours of operation?

Skyrail is open every day except Christmas Day and during planned preventative maintenance (for more information, please visit: www.skyrail.com.au/notices.html). Skyrail's hours of operation are 9.00am to 5.15pm; bookings are taken in 15 minute intervals from 9.00am until 2.45pm for a return journey, or 3.30pm for a one-way journey.

How often do gondolas leave the station?

Gondolas leave the station continuously; bookings are taken in 15 minute intervals (please see above for timings).

How long does a Skyrail Experience take?

To maximise the Skyrail Experience, allow up to 1 1/2 hours to complete a one-way journey, this would include spending 20 minutes at each of our two mid-stations. For a return experience, allow 2 1/2 hours plus time to spend in Kuranda.

How do you get to Skyrail?

Most day tour packages include transfers to Skyrail. For those that do not, Skyrail operates a coach transfer service from most tourist accommodation houses in Cairns, Beaches and Port Douglas areas.

How many people does a gondola carry?

Each gondola seats up to 6 people (including infants).

What can be taken on the cableway?

Daypacks and fold-up baby strollers can be taken on the cableway. Luggage is not able to be carried on the cableway or coach transfer service.

Are there any environmental restrictions when travelling on the cableway?

For the protection of the environment, smoking and the consumption of food and drink is prohibited in the gondolas.

Can children travel unaccompanied?

No. Children must be accompanied by an adult when travelling in a gondola.

Are there any shopping facilities?

Skyrail has two gift stores, located at Caravonica and Kuranda Terminals, offering an exclusive range of Skyrail Rainforest Cableway branded merchandise as well as refreshments.

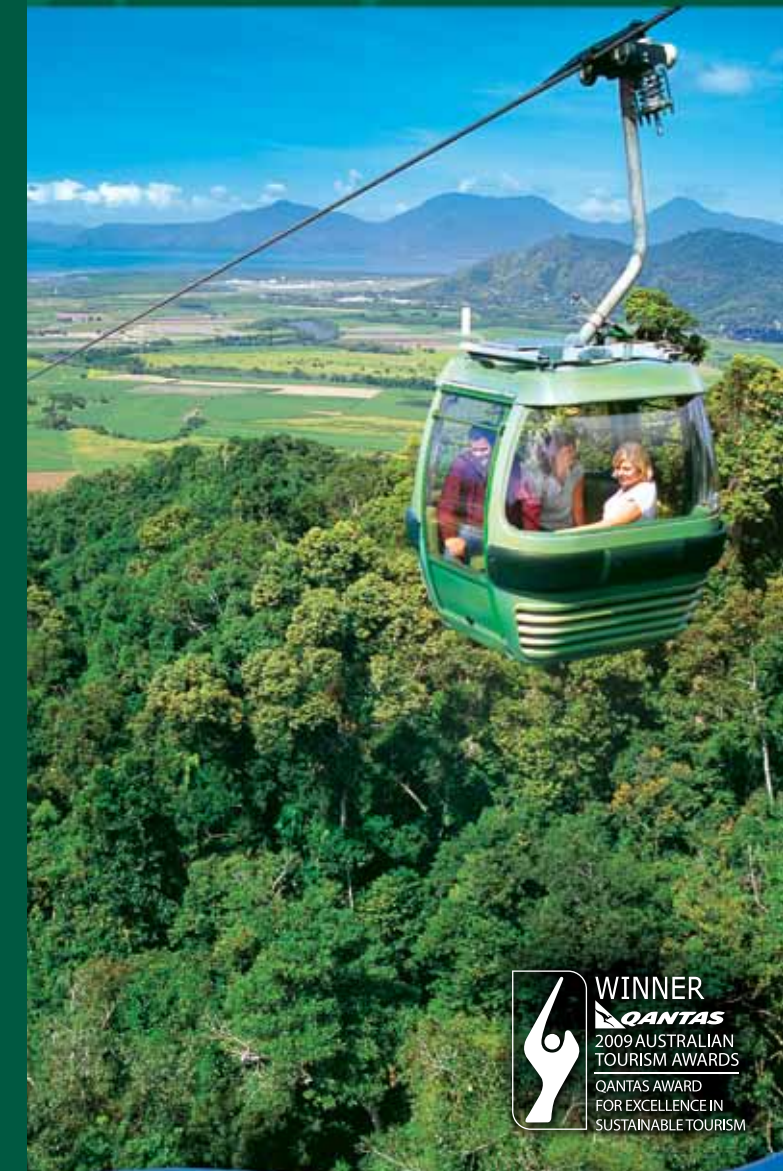

Caravonica Terminal



- Skyrail's Caravonica Terminal is located 15 minutes north of Cairns city and 50 minutes south of Port Douglas, providing a convenient departure or arrival point. Coach transfers are available from most locations; please ask at the time of booking.
- Boasting rugged mountain scenery, steep ravines, tumbling waterfalls, rich wildlife and tropical rainforest, Barron Gorge National Park is considered one of Queensland's most picturesque parks.
- Enjoy stunning, panoramic views from the comfort of a six-person gondola cabin, as you glide just metres above the rainforest canopy on this amazing 7.5km journey.
- Australia's Tropical Rainforests exist in a dynamic environment, shaped by seasonal weather patterns. Skyrail operates in all weather, rain or shine, and is The World's Most Beautiful Rainforest Experience.

Red Peak Station



- Lush rainforest surroundings at Red Peak Station invite you to take a closer look at the diverse array of plant species, including the towering 400 year-old Kauri Pine.
- Explore the forest floor on Skyrail's 175 metre rainforest boardwalk, which meanders through the tropical undergrowth taking you past majestic buttress roots, beautiful tree ferns and climbing wait-a-while palms.
- Be enthralled during an interpretive boardwalk tour as Skyrail's Rangers share their environmental and cultural knowledge of the area. Guided tours are held regularly throughout the day.
- Rainforest displays, touch tables and interpretive signage complete your visit to Red Peak Station, providing an insight into the rainforest's diverse array of flora and fauna.

Barron Falls Station



- Barron Falls is one of the most visited sites in Australia's World Heritage protected Tropical Rainforests. A mighty 260 metres (853 feet) tall, the majestic Barron Falls attracts visitors, photographers and artists from around the world.
- Enjoy a stroll along rainforest pathways and marvel at the spectacular beauty of the Barron Gorge and Falls, from one of Skyrail's three lookouts.
- Discover the fascinating history and evolution of Australia's Tropical Rainforests with a fun, learning experience at the interactive Rainforest Interpretation Centre.
- Step back through time with a visit to Skyrail's interesting historical displays and cultural signage.

Kuranda Terminal



- Skyrail's Kuranda Terminal is conveniently located beside the Kuranda Railway Station and is a short walk from the village of Kuranda.
- Kuranda, the 'Village in the Rainforest', boasts numerous attractions including a butterfly sanctuary, colourful bird aviary, koala park, walking tracks and a diverse array of galleries, shops, cafes and restaurants.
- Explore Kuranda's famous art and craft markets; they are open seven days a week. Enjoy fresh tropical juices and homemade ice-cream as you soak up the ambience created by local musicians and entertainers.
- We recommend you allow 1 1/2 hours for a one-way Skyrail experience and 2 1/2 hours for a return journey. Please note, these times refer specifically to your Skyrail experience, please allow additional time for a visit to Kuranda.
